

# Student Data

The following figures provide general information regarding the current student population at the University of St. Augustine for Health Sciences. Enrollment indicates students that are currently active in the university. Graduates (e.g., Alumni) are students that have fulfilled all internal and external requirements to obtain a degree from the university. Demographics (e.g., Gender, Race/Ethnicity, and Age) is general information regarding the student population. Ethnicity is the racial and ethnic background (e.g., Asian, Black, Hispanic, and White) of a student and the gender is their identified sex category (e.g., Male, Female).

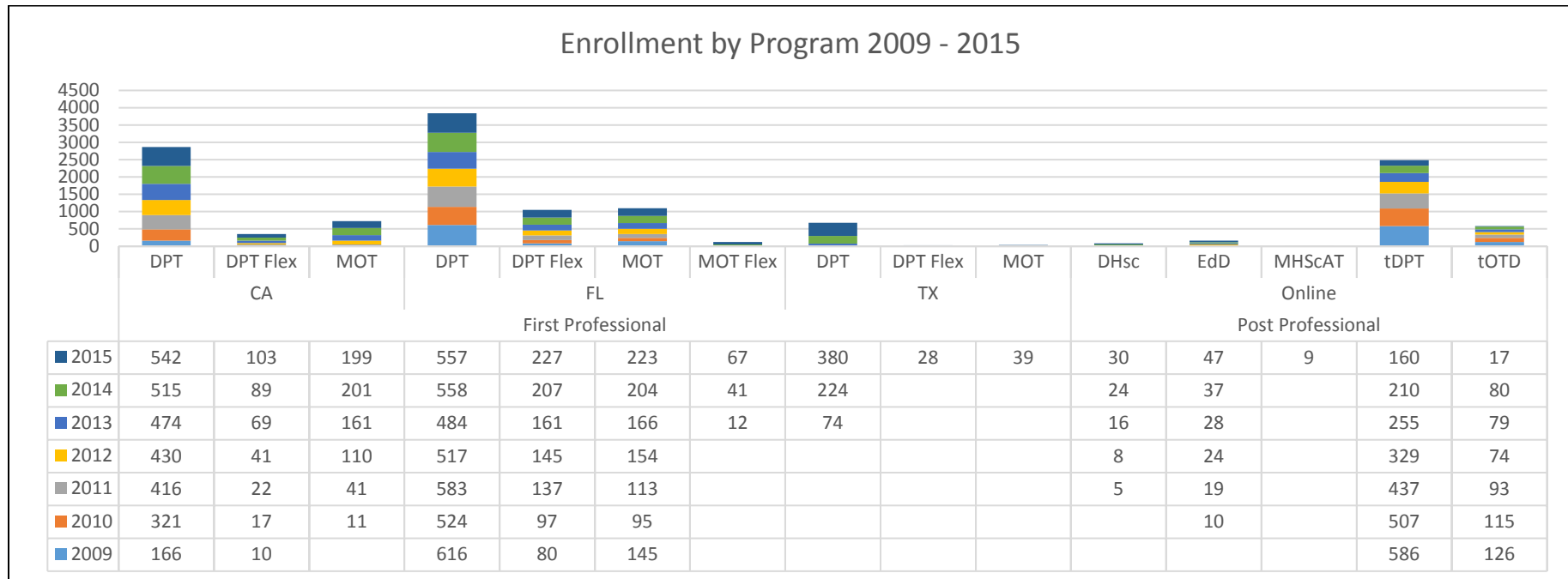

## University of St. Augustine for Health Sciences Program Enrollment

Figure 2 shows the student enrollment by campus, program, and year between 2009 and 2015. The counts indicate the enrollment in each given year. Enrollment counts reflect students that were enrolled during any one year or multiple years (e.g., student id # 1914 was in the enrollment count during 2013, 2014, and 2015.)



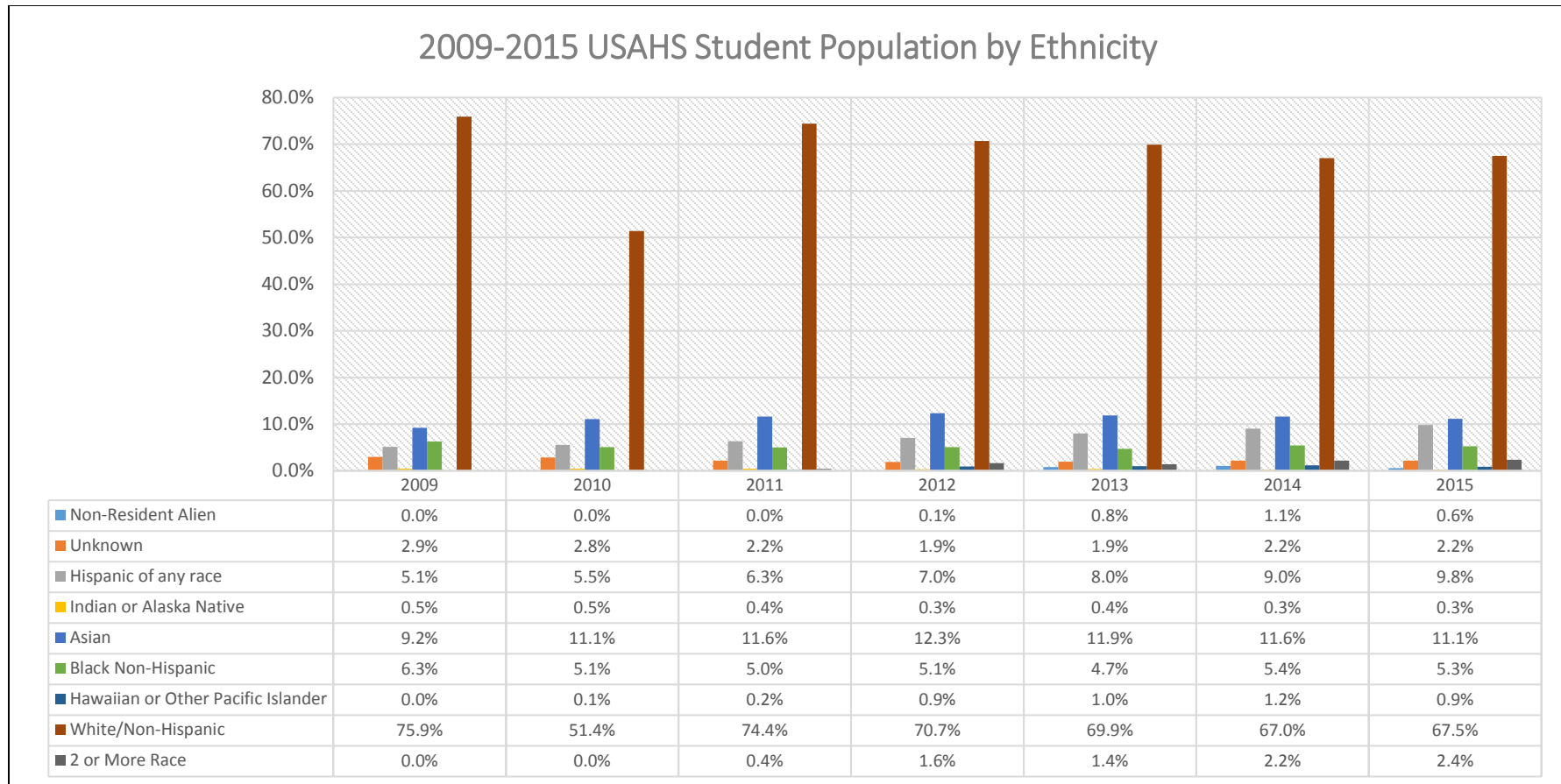
*Figure 1.* Enrollment by program between 2009 and 2015.

Program acronyms are as follows: DPT – Doctor of Physical Therapy, DPT Flex – Flexible Doctor of Physical Therapy, MOT – Master of Occupational Therapy, MOT Flex – Flexible Master of Occupational Therapy, DHSc –Doctor of Health Sciences, EdD –Doctor of Education, MHScAT – Master of Health Science in Athletic Training, tDPT –Transitional Doctor of Physical Therapy, tOTD –Transitional Doctor of Occupational Therapy. In 2013, new programs were added. In FL, the “MOT Flex” and in TX, the “DPT.” In 2015 DPT Flex and MOT in TX and MAT Online post professional program were added.

### Student Population by Ethnicity

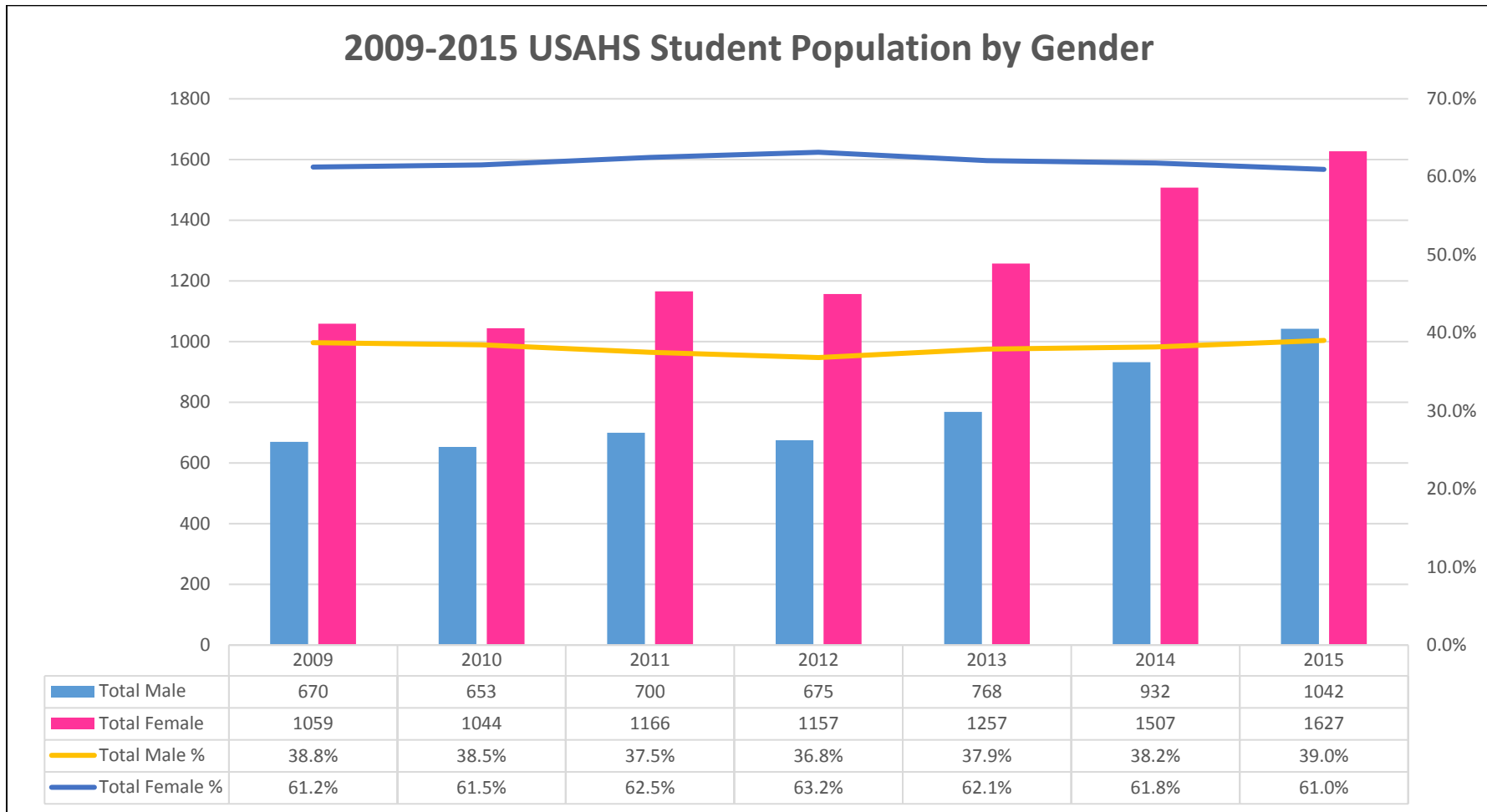


Figure 1. 2009 to 2015 total student population by gender.

Figure 1 shows total student population by ethnicity from 2009-2015. During this time period the ratio of ethnicity has changed marginally. The greatest changes are with White/non-Hispanic at a high of 75.9% in 2009 to a low of 51.4% in 2010 and Hispanic of any race increasing year after year from 5.1% in 2009 to 9.8% in 2015.

### Student Population by Gender

Figure 1 shows the total student population by gender from 2009-2015. During this time period the ratio of female to male has not changed much with a 60% to 40% ratio.
